

CLIR Mellon Dissertation Fellowships (2016)

The Council on Library and Information Resources (CLIR) is now accepting applications for the 2016 Mellon Fellowships for Dissertation Research in Original Sources. This fellowship program is designed to support junior scholars in the humanities who intend to use original sources in their doctoral dissertation research, and students of art history are encouraged to apply.

The program will be offering about fifteen competitively awarded fellowships in 2016. Each provides a stipend of \$2,000 per month for 9–12 months. Each fellow will receive an additional \$1,000 upon participating in a symposium on research in original sources and submitting an acceptable report to CLIR on the research experience. Thus the maximum award will be \$25,000.

Fellowship stipends will support research beginning between June 1 and September 1, 2016, and ending within 12 months of commencing. Applicants do not have to be U.S. citizens, but must be enrolled in a doctoral program in a graduate school in the United States.
