- brief c.v. (2-page maximum).
- cover sheet with name, school, title of paper, and name of faculty adviser on the proposed paper, as well as its relation to the doctoral dissertation.
- 2-page (500-word) abstract.

To be considered, proposals must be received by Sunday, December 18, 2016. Invitations to participate will be sent out by email no later than January 17, 2017.
