Proposal abstracts should be no more than 500 words, should be accompanied by a current c.v. and must be received by July 1, 2011. Per CAA guidelines, final abstracts of accepted papers will be due August 5, 2011, and full texts of the accepted papers will be due December 2, 2011.
