Arp: Influence and Exchange

The Finnis Scott Symposium at Turner Contemporary

Thursday 23-Friday 24 November 2017

A symposium exploring the work of Hans Jean Arp in conjunction with the exhibition Arp: The Poetry of Forms at Turner Contemporary. Organised by Turner Contemporary in partnership with the School of Modern Languages, Literatures and Cultures, Royal Holloway, University of London.

The notion of a 'poetry of forms' is powerfully expressed in the sculptures, reliefs, drawings, paintings, poems and other texts of Hans Jean Arp (1886-1966). Enriched with originality and humour, the works he produced throughout a long career establish a web of relationships, echoes and dialogues. Both individually and as a whole they continue to develop new meanings.

This symposium will explore Arp's influence on and engagement with many of the major art movements of the twentieth century and his collaborations with artists of the European avant-garde, as well as his enduring legacy today. It is organised alongside the first major exhibition in a public gallery of Arp's work in the UK since 1962, co-curated by Frances Guy and Prof. Eric Robertson.
