The aim of the satellite is to provide a forum for researchers working on the interfaces of Network Science, Arts, Culture, and Technology to introduce their work to the community through short presentations or actions that push the mutual boundaries of these fields, both critically and creatively, and to nurture discussion. 3. A single relevant image (2000 x 2000 pixel max)
