The Römisches Jahrbuch provides a forum for the latest methodological and content-related debates in art history, thus contributing to the further development of the academic discipline. All articles approved by the Editorial Committee are subject to double-blind review by international experts and receive professional editing and comprehensive proofreading. The Römisches Jahrbuch is available in print and, starting in 2019, electronically. The hardcover edition is distributed by the publishing house Hirmer based in Munich, Germany.

Essays may be submitted in German, English, Italian or French via e-mail as text documents by Monday, December 10th, 2018. For the assessment of submitted manuscripts low-resolution images (e.g. in a PDF file) are sufficient. The average article length is between 80.000 – 120.000 characters (spaces included), but in exceptional cases contributions of up to 250.000 characters may be accepted.
