The Medici Archive Project is pleased to announce the dates for the 2019 Summer seminars in paleography and archival studies: Session I (3-8 June) and Session II (1-6 July).

The principal aim of this seminar is to provide an introduction to Italian archives (with particular emphasis on Florentine archival collections); to examine in-depth various documentary typologies; to read diverse early modern scripts; and to learn how to plan research in Italian archives and libraries. Especially relevant for graduate students, university faculty, and museum curators working on Renaissance and early modern topics, this seminar is taught by a team of current and former MAP scholars, as well as university professors and other MAP-affiliated researchers.

The seminar week is composed of lectures and transcription sessions, lasting between 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ to 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ hours.

In addition, MAP staff will organize a one-day visit to Venice or Rome archives.

A working knowledge of Italian is recommended. No previous archival and paleographic experi-

ence is required.

Students will be encouraged to develop and augment their research with archival approaches, meet with instructors individually in order to strategize future archival research in Italy, network with scholars in their field, and gain access to archives and libraries resources pertinent to their

research.
