- Prepare and teach courses in art history and theory of the early modern period with a special interest in the Afterlife of Antiquity – in the BA tracks (Kunst & Cultuur and Arts, Media and Society) and in our MA Arts and Culture (languages of instruction: Dutch and English);
- Engage in all usual forms of instruction in these programmes, including supervising internships and excursions, supervising BA and MA theses, both in Dutch and in English;
- Play an active role in recruiting Dutch and international students by contributing to open days, orientation and information sessions;
- Participate in the development and implementation of educational innovations – also in digital form;
- Conduct research based on an individual research plan within one of the research programmes of LUCAS and present the results in the form of publications, conference presentations and other means;
- Acquire project funding at national, European and international level (NWO, ERC, Horizon Europe etc.);
- Co-supervise PhD candidates;
- Participate in the academic community of the Institute;
- Bring an extensive network in the working field.

- Demonstrable interest in (or knowledge of) aesthetics/art philosophy;
