The Department of Art History and Archaeology announces an appointment for a Visiting Assistant Professor for one or two semesters, pending funding.

Applicants should be specialists in medieval art and architecture. The PhD must be completed by August 15, 2001 for appointment at this rank. Salary and benefits are competitive.

The department offers the BA, MA, and PhD degrees in classical archaeology and art history. This position requires teaching in introductory and intermediate surveys as well as advanced (undergraduate/graduate) lecture courses in both programs. The department includes nine full-time faculty. There are normally about 60 undergraduate majors and 25 graduate students. Graduate degrees in art history and archaeology can be combined with interdisciplinary minors in Ancient Studies, Medieval and Renaissance Studies, Museum Studies, Historic Preservation, and Women Studies. The University of Missouri-Columbia is the main campus of the state university system and offers a broad range of undergraduate and graduate programs.
