We seek applicants whose main area of research focuses on the history of modern architecture in Europe and America, but we will also consider exceptional applicants with research expertise in any period of European architecture from the Renaissance onwards.

You should normally have a PhD and a strong commitment to research, preferably with a record of publication, in the field of architectural history and/or theory. You will be expected to teach courses on modern architecture, as well as contributing to the general and core courses offered by the Department. The appointment is for a fixed term of six months from 1 January 2002.
