Successful candidates will enrol as of 1 April 2004, on a full-time programme of research studies leading to the award of the degree of Doctor of Philosophy. The studentships will comprise fees and an annual stipend of £12,000 and will be awarded for a period of up to three years subject to satisfactory progress. The studentships are tenable in the School of Art and Design at the Belfast campus.

The closing date for receipt of completed applications is 13 February 2004.

Interviews will be held during the week commencing 27 February 2004.
