The concept of classical antiquity encompasses a changing canon of ideas and examples. During the eighteenth century it tends to be identified with Greek culture. But there are concurrent ideas of classical Greece, nourished by different sources. On the one hand there's the tradition of antiquarianism, academic art, the grand tour. On the other there's a new focus on empirical evidence, leading to modern Greek archaeology. In the early nineteenth century the more mediated, traditional approach comes to an end. The panel invites proposals that explore the relations between the creative tradition of classicism and the history of classical scholarship. Approaches might focus on aesthetics and history of the arts. Proposals for papers should be sent directly to the seminar chairs no later than 15 September 2005.
