13th Gerson Lecture:

Ingrid D. Rowland , 'The Roman Garden of Agostino Chigi'

On the 17th of November Professor Ingrid D. Rowland will give the 13th Gerson lecture in the Aula of the University of Groningen, The Netherlands. Professor Rowlands is Professor at the University of Notre Dame School of Architecture in Rome, and the author of numerous articles and several books, including *The Scarith of Scornello. A Tale of Renaissance Forgery* (2004) and *The Culture of the High Renaissance: Ancients and Moderns in Sixteenth-Century Rome* (1998). She will lecture on: 'The Roman Garden of Agostino Chigi'. Her text will be available immediately after the lecture (€ 8,50), as volume 13 of the series 'Gerson Lectures'.

Preceding the Gerson lecture, there will be two additional lectures on related topics, by Prof. Jeroen Stumpel (University of Utrecht) and Dr. Caroline van Eck (University of Groningen). They will be held in the lecture room of the Department of Art History, Oude Boteringestraat 34, Groningen.
