The Umbra Institute in Perugia, Italy, a study abroad program for American college students, is seeking for this next semester a professor to teach two sections of Italian Renaissance Art History. The semester begins February 1, and ends April 30.

The Umbra Institute is located in the heart of Perugia's historic center, and enrolls students from across the United States for the semester or academic year. More information about Umbra can be found on the web site, [www.umbra-institute.com](http://www.umbra-institute.com)

These two sections will enroll ca. 25-30 students each, and the material covered usually ranges from Cimabue to Raphael. The most recent textbooks used include the Frederick Hartt survey and Paoletti and Radke. Included in the semester would be an overnight trip to Florence for each section, and any relevant sites here in Perugia, such as the Galleria Nazionale and Perugino's Collegio del Cambio. On-site visits can be designed according to the professor's wishes.

A PhD in Art History is preferred, with experience teaching American college undergraduates.

S/he will be responsible for the initiation and development of special exhibitions, course related programs and other initiatives in partnership with faculty and students that integrate the Davis's collections and exhibitions with teaching and research at the college.

Applications are invited from candidates with expertise in art history and extensive knowledge of a broad spectrum of the arts and humanities as well as a strong interest in the museum as a venue for their presentation and investigation. The Kemper Curator will collaborate closely with museum staff and with faculty across disciplines as well as with students through the creation of innovative exhibitions, programs, publications and alternative programming in the community and on campus and possibly in collaboration with other museums in the greater Boston area.
