RESPONSIBILITIES: Teach undergraduate and graduate art history courses in area of specialty as well as art appreciation and art history survey. Establish a program of research that leads to publication and seek external funding. Additional duties will include advising students (both undergraduate and graduate) and service to the School and University.
