The Department of Art & Art History at Stanford University seeks applications for a tenure-track, assistant professor position with expertise in European Renaissance Art. The appointment is expected to begin on 1 September 2007. We hope to attract a pool of scholars with a wide range of research interests and methods. The successful candidate will be expected to develop a cycle of core Renaissance courses in both Mediterranean and Northern European art and architecture for our undergraduate majors, and to offer graduate-level courses and seminars related to his or her research interests. Recent recipients of the Ph.D. are invited to apply, but we are especially interested in candidates with a record of one to three years of successful teaching at the university level. The ideal candidate would also bring to Stanford evidence of scholarly promise and a program of future research that should attract graduate students of the highest caliber.

Stanford offers excellent research facilities, several programs (such as our Interdisciplinary Program in the Humanities) designed to foster the professional development of young scholars, and competitive salaries and benefits.
