As assistant professor of architectural history at the Department of Art History of the Radboud University Nijmegen you will develop and teach architectural history courses (16th through 19th centuries) at the undergraduate and graduate level. The Department of Art History offers students the opportunity to work closely with instructors and fellow students in small seminars. We give preference to applicants with research ambitions and a publication record. Your research will relate to one of the areas of study of the research institute HLCS (Historical, Literary, and Cultural Studies).

Candidates must have earned a Ph.D. in art or architectural history, have university teaching experience, and an excellent knowledge of architecture and the visual arts of the early modern period. The successful applicant will contribute to innovations in education and have administrative and managerial skills.
