The Skin of Things 2 is the virtual edition and follow-up conference to <a href="https://theskinofthings.github.io/">https://theskinofthings.github.io/</a> that took place at the Rijksmuseum, Amsterdam in 2019. Organized by the Technical University Delft and the University of Utrecht, TSOT is a multidisciplinary gathering centered around the perception and depiction of materials in art and visual culture. The list of speakers includes artists, art producers, museum curators, and scholars from science of perception, cognition, computer science, art history, conservation science - in short a diverse group that you rarely meet in one (virtual) room. Therefore, we happily invite you to join the talks and discussions over a series of 5 evenings/nights (Asia/Oceania), afternoons (Europe/Africa) and mornings (Americas).
