The successful candidate will undertake teaching, assessment and administrative duties relevant to the requirements of the School. They will teach on the undergraduate MA programme in Film and Visual Culture, the MLitt programme in Film, Visual Culture and Arts Management, and on other programmes as agreed with the Head of School. They will also contribute to the supervision of research students, and will undertake research of internationally recognised quality. Applicants should hold a PhD in a relevant area and some experience of university teaching.

You will have a PhD in a relevant area and/or relevant industry experience. You will have some experience of teaching at undergraduate and postgraduate levels, and ideally of working with students from diverse backgrounds. You will have native or near-native competence in English, and excellent written and spoken communication skills. You will be able to engage with students effectively in both face-to-face and online settings, and will be able to promote student learning in a range of ways.

You will have extensive experience in film and digital media practice accompanied by an excellent understanding of the contemporary film and media industry. You will be able to convene/teach on existing modules such as Introduction to Film and the Cinematic Experience as well as to develop new courses in your areas of expertise for UG and PG programmes.

Salary will be at the appropriate point on the Grade 7 salary scale, (£41,526 - £49,552 per annum)

and negotiable with placement according to qualifications and experience.

Any appointment will be made subject to satisfactory references and probation period.
