The Department of Art in the College of Arts and Sciences at American University invites applications for a term faculty appointment at the rank of Professorial Lecturer or Instructor, with a specialization in the art and visual culture of the Modern and/or Contemporary period for Academic Year 2021-2022. All faculty are expected to hold office hours and participate in service to the program through capstone advising and internal committee appointments.
