Beyond borders: Towards a transnational World History of Design Organized by the Design History Society

The editorial project "World History of Design," initiated by the late Victor Margolin, is one of the most ambitious and challenging projects in the history of our discipline. Volumes 1 and 2 were published by Bloomsbury in 2015. They are the result of Victor's many years of teaching design history, his world travels, his library of books and catalogues collected over the years, and his friendships with designers and design historians around the world. After his passing, Sylvia Margolin and Rebecca Houze decided to continue the third and fourth volumes with a new approach. They invited diverse authors from different regions of the world to contribute chapters on specific regions, countries and times. However, what demands should a contemporary world history of design fulfil today? How can a national approach contribute to a design historiography in an age of globalisation? How can national design histories reflect transnational and local processes? And, how can they be embedded in a global discourse on design history?

This DHS virtual afternoon symposium seeks to foster exchange to find intersections and overlaps between various chapters of the World History of Design Volume 3 and identify transnational narrative strands. A second symposium exploring design histories of further countries in Volume 4, is planned. The keynote lecture on national design histories in an age of globalisation and transnational possibilities in Design History by Grace Lees-Maffei is intended to stimulate debate and provide trajectories for discussion. Various authors involved in the project will then take up the ideas and discuss transnational issues in a panel discussion.
