9th International Conference for Art Libraries: Art information: reflection and the future.

The international network of art libraries centered around the Art Discovery Group Catalogue (https://artdiscovery.net/) will come together for the 9th time to hold its bi-annual conference, this year at the Zentralinstitut für Kunstgeschichte (ZI = Central Institute for Art History) in Munich, Germany. The conference is both a meeting of the partner libraries of the Art Discovery Group Catalogue project and an occasion to mark the 10th anniversary of the Future of Art Bibliography Initiative (FAB, https://www.getty.edu/research/institute/development_collaborations/fab/) as an instructive and aspirational lens through which to view many of the major community-based projects that have developed in our domain over the past decade.
