

## Lecturer in "Expressive Culture: Film", New York University Berlin

New York University (NYU) Berlin is seeking a part-time lecturer to teach Expressive Culture: Film, a version of our NYU New York course that includes formal approaches to film studies and critically engages with the medium to look at artistic expression in light of social and historical contexts. While we are open to suggestions for the exact area of concentration, the course should be inflected to the Berlin locale with a concern for German cinema.

The language in instruction is English, and the course is planned to be offered in both the Spring 2023 and Summer 2023 terms. The spring semester runs from January 25 to May 15, 2023, with a week-long break from March 13-19. In this term, the class meets once per week for four and a half hours. During the summer semester, which runs from May 23 to June 29, 2023, the class meets twice a week for four hours and forty five minutes. Classes are scheduled to accommodate screenings of feature-length films.

Candidates should be available to teach during both terms and be passionate about teaching a diverse cohort of undergraduate students. While the course does serve as an entry to the program in Cinema Studies, as a part of the College Core Curriculum, Expressive Culture is intended particularly to serve the general education needs of students with no prior background in the discipline, and for whom this will likely be their only such course. Course content and pedagogical approaches should therefore be designed specifically to ensure accessibility for a variety of students. NYU is committed to providing a campus community that reflects and enacts the values of inclusion, diversity, belonging, and equity, which inform academic excellence. The lecturer is expected to support and promote this commitment both in and outside of the classroom through critical approaches to the formation of social difference.
