Dorothy and Dale Thompson Missouri Professorship in Global Arts with a focus on Museum Studies at University of Missouri-Kansas City, School of Humanities and Social Sciences, Department of Media, Art and Design.

The Department of Media, Art and Design at the University of Missouri-Kansas City is conducting a search for the Dorothy and Dale Thompson Missouri Professorship in Global Arts with a focus on Museum Studies and Community-Engaged Curation. We are seeking applications from candidates who have expertise in art history or a related field with experience in museum studies and curatorial practice. The ideal advanced career candidate will demonstrate a strong scholarly record and curatorial portfolio which is eligible for tenure at the Associate or full Professor rank. They will design new undergraduate courses focused on developing museum professional skills and connecting students with communities in the urban sphere, locally and worldwide. They would also offer art history or visual studies courses which complement the existing BA program's strengths in modern Latinx, Latin American and Caribbean art, as well as global contemporary art with participatory and site-specific elements.

The successful candidate will have an exceptional approach to their own research, developing and maintaining a national and international reputation. They will be someone capable of collaborating and affiliating with UMKC programs and departments, especially the Center of Digital and Public Humanities and the Department of Race, Ethnic, and Gender Studies (REGS). The selected candidate would mentor undergraduate students and strengthen the department's collaborations with local art institutions such as the Nelson-Atkins Museum of Art, Kemper Museum of Contemporary Art, and Charlotte Street Foundation. They would also play a critical role in the curation of the department's own UMKC Gallery of Art, which hosts visiting artists, scholars and gallery exhibitions, supplements coursework and provides unique interactive learning opportunities outside of the classroom.

Endowed professorships are among the most prestigious positions in the university and are reserved for the most distinguished scholars and leaders. Individuals appointed to these positions are expected to enhance the quality of the university's academic programs through their contributions to teaching and scholarship. These positions also enhance the reputation of the university and help to attract high-achieving students and faculty members. Minimum Qualifications:

Ph.D. in Art History or terminal degree in a related field, such as Museum Studies, Global Studies, African and Africana Studies, American Studies, Near Eastern Studies, Visual Anthropology, and Visual Studies. Applicants must have a record of success in academic research, professional curatorial experience, the ability to teach students from a variety of backgrounds, and skills in collaborating with diverse communities.

Full Time:

We are seeking an exceptional faculty member in the rank of Associate or Full Professor to fulfill this full-time, benefit-eligible, 9-month endowed professorship position. This position will begin in August 2024.

Salary:

Salary is negotiable and commensurate with experience, faculty rank, demonstrated success in externally funded scholarly activity/research, and indication of national and/or international scholarly reputation.
