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Preserving Memory. Holocaust Monuments and Memorials in Central Europe.

This international conference will focus on the expert evaluation of the topic of Holocaust monuments and memorials in Central Europe. The aim of the meeting is to present the historical, political, social and art historical circumstances of the creation of these often neglected works and their theoretical starting points, as well as the subsequent reception of Holocaust monuments and memorials.

In the broader social and cultural context, we are interested in the problem of the formation of Jewish and Roma identity; and, at the same time, the topic of the individual, collective and cultural memory of the Holocaust tragedy and its projection into specific monument and memorial realizations.

We invite submissions from those interested in active participation in the form of a proposal (the title of the contribution and a brief résumé – max. 800 characters) by 31 May 2024 at the latest to the address: [janacova@udu.cas.cz](mailto:janacova@udu.cas.cz). The length of the contribution should not be more than 15 minutes; the conference language is English.
