The application documents should be attached as a single PDF file. Panel proposals should include abstracts for the panel and for each individual paper. The deadline for submissions is November 15, 2024.

Please note that the Forum will be held in person. Speakers are expected to present their papers on-site. We advise participants to apply for travel funds from their home institutions. Modest travel subsidies may be made available by the Forum later.
