The conference aims to critically reflect on the complex processes of meaning-making, interpretation, and reinterpretation of Mexican art in European collections, museums, and galleries.

The conference welcomes contributions addressing themes such as:

Postcolonial, decolonial, and transnational perspectives in studying Mexican art in Europe

Methodologies for studying processes of cultural transfer

Critical revision of European interpretations of Mexican art

History of acquisition and movement of works

Exhibition and curatorial strategies in shaping narratives about Mexican art

Digital presence of Mexican collections

Reception and hybridization of Mexican art in Europe

Case studies of selected works in European collections

Abstract in English (approximately 250 words)

Brief biographical note (up to 100 words)

Selected papers will be published in a peer-reviewed conference volume following the event. The conference will be held online, and participation is free of charge.
