on the scientific community based on themes linked to the axes of the Laboratoire de Recherches en Histoire Rhône-Alpes (LARHRA UMR 5190). Interactions between history and art history, notably through visual and material cultures, form one of the magazine's key bases.

The journal encourages exchange and collaboration between young and established researchers, according to the Peer Review principle. Articles are published in one of the following five languages: French, English, Spanish, Italian, German.

First drafts of full "Varia" (between 35,000 and 55,000 characters) are due by February 27, 2026. Proposals will then be evaluated anonymously, on the basis of peer review, in accordance with the journal's usual practice. Up to 10 captioned images (300 dpi) may be submitted, free of copyright.
