The 'global turn' in the humanities and social sciences has in recent years challenged art historians, curators and cultural theorists to rethink the conceptual frameworks of the discipline. This has generated a fierce debate about the premises, research agendas, langu-ages and institutional locations of an art history redefined as global: positions in this debate range from expansion, remapping or the advocacy of a 'horizontal art history'.

Taking our cue from what the philosopher Peter Osborne has called the 'fiction of the contemporary', that is a geopolitical fiction identifying the global with contemporary art, this conference seeks to revisit the foun-dational moments of the discipline of art history in the West as well as the re-configurations it underwent in new settings.

The world was a key factor in discourses of modernity of which art history both partook and contributed to shaping. Engaging with the discipline's genealogy calls for an examination of its assumptions and structures of argu-mentation, its cosmopolitan potential and its ultimate choice of nationalist frames.

This conference seeks to concatenate both ends of the history of art history, its origins in the modern world and its transformations in the global age. The participants address migratory and translational dimensions of cultures, including their strategies of negotiation, the agency of actors and institutions and the nexus of power within which these are implicated.
