Combine the following documents into a single file attachment; do not send multiple files:

- brief c.v. (2-page maximum).

- cover sheet with name, school, title of paper, and name of faculty adviser on the proposed paper as well as its relation to the doctoral dissertation.

- 2-page (500 word) abstract.

To be considered, proposals must be received by Monday, January 12, 2015. Invitations to participate will be sent out by email before February 1, 2015.
