Fellowships are available for advanced graduate students and younger faculty to attend CASBS' 2011 Summer Workshop on Cognitive Science/Neuroscience and the Humanities. Held from July 24 - August 6, 2011, the workshop will consist of 10 days of tutorials and exploration of ways in which cognitive science and neuroscience may be employed creatively by scholars from the humanities.
